# **Objectives and activities**

Since 2015, our organisation Wheels to Heal has recycled over 4500 wheelchairs and 1500 other types of mobility aids such as zimmer frames, commodes and walking sticks for reuse overseas. This also includes some high value items, such as electric wheelchairs, specialised baths and hoists. We are committed to remaining a 100% donation and volunteer led project.

Research has found that in developing countries only 10% of disabled people possess a wheelchair. This means that millions of disabled people in third-world countries face unnecessary barriers to fulfilling their life potential.

Many simply can't afford a new wheelchair which can cost anywhere between £300-£500.

Our charity has continued to build and expand upon the foundation we have established over the past few years. We have improved the physical, emotional and often the economic well-being of thousands of people who face barriers to mobility due to impoverished situations, social stigma, access and conflict.

We have achieved this by:

- Developing an incredibly small but successful supply of recycled wheelchairs and upcycling these to send them overseas
- During 2018 we initiated and developed a quarterly uplift service throughout the Central Belt of Scotland and have now extended this to cover mainland Scotland from the Borders to the Highlands. Over 66% of the 600 care homes contacted responded favourably and 1500 aids were collected.
- Through substantive effort from our core volunteers we raised over £25,000 pounds through Just Giving and were honoured to be invited as finalists to their Annual

This substantially increased the exposure of our work and connected us to other organisations who may partner or support us in the future.

- We have attended the Glasgow Mela festival increasing our reach to a wider local audience
- Helping to dispel myths about the disabled and reducing the stigma these individuals face in many of the recipient countries.
- Reducing the amount of waste and landfill in the UK through recycling and reusing the mobility aids overseas and benefitting people who have no access to this type of life changing equipment

 Enabling those who cannot afford or have no access to mobility aids in many countries which are either developing their economy or facing conflict or civil unrest

Our ethos is humanitarian and our goal is to recycle mobility aids which can be reused by people in areas without access to the same support system that exists in the UK for the disabled.



# **Charity's policy on reserves**

As an organisation our objective is to raise funding, collect, store, recycle and send unused and unwanted mobility aids from the UK and deliver these to those in desperate need overseas. Until we expand, we have no requirements for financial reserves as we use all donations to uplift mobility aids, load containers and deliver these to as many locations abroad as we can fund.

We have been fortunate to have had a storage location donated to us and our only outlay is to cover utility bills.

Part of our expansion plan is to look into obtaining external funding support for a project worker with the aim of extending our capability across the UK which will require storage locations and vehicle support at which time our approach to reserves will be amended to reflect items such as depreciation and maintenance.

Until that time we continue to use all donations, including Gift Aid to support the acquisition and delivery of aids to the end recipient.

# **Donated facilities and services**

As above we have the use of an area within a building, free of charge other than utility bill sharing, for a location within Tradeston in Glasgow. Occassionally we benefit from businesses providing access to vans which help lowers our transportation costs . All physical work is carried out voluntarily and similarly with administrative duties.

# **Future plans**

Due to the success of our Care Home Quarterly Uplift initiative and the fact that over one million items are potentially discarded across the UK that could benefit those who are disabled overseas, we are going to actively pursue funding applications to obtain project workers to facilitate expanding this across the UK.

We are looking into the potential to host a grassroots event to showcase the work we have undertaken and the success this has had in transforming lives abroad as part of a large fundraising exercise.

## **Additional information**

We have expanded our volunteer base from 22 to 36.

Our social media profile has grown. Our Facebook followers have doubled in numbers from 216 to 453. In June 2019 alone our Facebook posts reached 2631 people.

We have benefited from the generousity of businesses who extend goodwill to us and discounted rates for promotional material, vehicle hire and food and drink for volunteers.

We have formed relationships with a number of overseas partners to help deliver the mobility aids. Agencies overseas that liaise with us to support our projects include:
